"NC 90392390. Enclosure with Earth House." (1)

"A hut circle with a ruinous souterrain attached, in a westerly aspect, discovered during field investigation on the north edge of abandoned 18/19th century settlement." (OSFI:WDJ:3.6.1961)

"The hut is 12.0m diameter inside a heather-covered wall spread to 2.5 broad and standing, in the N, to 1.0m. The entrance, unusually, is in the NW arc. There is another break, 1.5m wide in the S, from which extends the souterrain curving sharply to the W round the outside of the hut. It is only visible as a regular area of subsidence, about 10.0m in length by 2.0m broad, having one or two slabs lying displaced across it, and smaller stone partially visible in the sides of the collapse. An associated stony bank proceeds from the SSE quarter of the hut, in a southerly direction, for about 60.0m before fading. There is no evidence of associated cultivation (but see HNC 92 SW 035)."
