A chambered round cairn of the Orkney-Cromarty group, now a conspicuous grass-grown mound, steep-sided and flat-topped and apparently almost intact apart from the chamber roof which has collapsed. It is 55ft in diameter and 6ft high, and the entrance has been from the east, on which side two large passage lintels are exposed about 20ft from the edge, as are the passage walls, 3ft apart, of flat horizontally-laid slabs. To the west of the lintels, a transverse slab projects from the north side; its partner to the south was visible in 1910 (3). A short stretch of the south wall of the chamber, consisting of a few slightly oversailing courses, can also be seen.


Description. The cairn is situated in undulating moorland at 250ft. OD. It is a conspicuous grass-grown mound, steep-sided and flat-topped, and appears to be almost complete except for the chamber roof. The diameter is 55ft. and the height 6ft. The entrance has been from the E. At about 20ft. from the edge on this side are exposed two large lintels over the passage. The tops of the passage walls of horizontally laid flat slabs are visible under the outer lintel, and are 3ft. apart. The outer ends of these walls have the appearance of being a built corner, and it is probable that a wall-face runs round the chamber in the body of the cairn. To the w of the lintels a transverse slab projects from the N side while its partner to the S was formerly visible. A Short stretch of the s wall of the chamber can be seen consisting of a few slightly oversailing courses. The chamber roof has evidently collapsed and no more of the plan can be discerned at present.


A cairn about 60ft, to the N is so ruined that nothing of its internal structure can be seen.

• In the Inventory the names of two sites have been confused. Brawlbin Long is marked "Sithean Mor" on the 6 in. OS. map, but the name "Shean Mor", Brawlbin, has been given to this site in the Inventory, which is named "Sithean Buidhe" on the map. The latter name is used here.

Chambered cairn. 'Sithean Buidhe'. 'Shean Mor'. Dimensions:


