Torr Beag, Brawlbin: Orkney-Cromarty, Round. This chambered cairn, on flat moorland, is placed on a slight natural rise a little below 450 ft 0 D. It is heathercovered and still about 8 ft high. The diameter is about 55 to 60 ft but the edge is rather indefinite. The centre has been disturbed and the roof of the chamber has collapsed. The entrance has been from the SE. About 20 ft from the cairn edge on this side are two lintels, probably in situ over the inner part of the passage. Four feet behind them are a pair of transverse slabs but at present no more of the structure can be made out with certainty. An apparently earth-fast slab stands 6 ft W of the transverse slabs; its function is not clear.


