IN THE MATTER OF THE ANCIENT MONULE IS ACTS, 1913 and 1931.

To Alan Douglas Pilkington of Achvarasdal, Reay, the owner of the Monuments known as "Tota an Dranndain" and "Tulach Gorm" consisting of (First) "Tota an Dranndain" occupying a circular area of ground measuring fifty three feet in diameter on the north-west side of the footpath leading from the road between Loch Shurrery and Broubster to Torr a' Bhathaich, the southmost point of said area being situated two hundred and twenty yards east by north of the north-east corner of the north-west by west of the Forss Water at its nearest point and twenty yards east-north-east of a burn flowing in a general north-north-east direction to the east of Torr a' Bhathaich to join said Water and (Second) "Tulach Gorm" occupying a circular area of ground to the south-south-east of said Tota an Dranndain bounded on the east by said Water and measuring forty yards in diameter, the eastmost point of said second-mentioned area being situated two hundred and eighty yards north by west of the bridge carrying said road running north from Loch Shurrery over said Water and one hundred and twenty yards west-north-west of the Bench Mark 330.9 on the west side of the bridge carrying said road over a small burn to the north of said first mentioned bridge, being the subjects indicated in red colour on the annexed plan and being part of the property known as the Farm and lands of Shurrery or Shuraray situated in the Parish of Reay and County of Caithness.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 6 of the Ancient Monuments Act, 1931, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Works and Public Buildings hereby give you notice that it is their intention to include the Monument above specified in a list of monuments to be published by them under Section 12 of the Ancient Monuments Consolidation and Amendment Act, 1913.



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

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THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Tota an Dranndain, broch, Shurrery comprises the remains of a broch, a fortified dwelling of Iron Age date, together with the remains of associated structures and outer defences. The broch survives as a large mound, largely grass-grown but showing sufficient structural detail to discern an overall diameter of 17m and an internal diameter of 9m. It stands over 1.5m high. The area to be scheduled is a circle 60m in diameter, to include the broch, the outer works and an area around, within which evidence of the broch's construction and use is likely to survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Reay and the County of Caithness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the subjects described in the Disposition by Sir Robert David Black in favour of Trustees for Alan Roger Douglas Pilkington dated 18 and 25 February 1988 and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Caithness on 22 March 1988 (the present owners whereof being ARD Settled Land Act Fund, per Messrs Preston and Redman, Solicitors, Hinton House, Hinton Road, Bournemouth), is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.




