"NG 8483 2028. Cist." (1) (3)					
"A cist containing an urn with human remains was found on top of a gravel mound near Scallisaig House." (2)					
"One side and one end stone only remains of this cist, giving measurements of c.1.4m x c.0.6m x c.0.3m deep. A large slab embedded into the mound, close by the cist, is probably the capstone." (OSFI:RL:5.10.1966)					
"This cist occurs in the centre of a turf-covered stony mound 5.8m in diam. and 0.6m high, almost certainly a cairn placed on the summit of a glacial knoll." (OSFI:AA:19.6.1974)
