"In a sheltered moorland valley between 850 ft. and 1,000 ft. O.D., in the area around the confluence of Amhainn Alligin and a small burn, are the remains of 41 roughly-built dry-stone shielings known as Braigh an Eireannaich, a name still known locally. The shielings, situated close to running water in rough pasture, are oval and circular. The average dimensions of the former are $4.5m \times 3.2m$., and they vary in ht. from grass-covered footings to 1.4m., whereas the latter measure 2.5m average diameter and vary from grass-covered footings to 0.7m high. In both cases, the walls are approximately 0.7m thick, and the entrance, where visible, is from 0.4m to 0.7m wide, generally facing the stream. A modern sheep fold has been constructed NE of the shielings, which were last used about 80 years ago." (OSRT · NKR · 7 4 1965)
