

I am directed by the Scottish Ministers to inform the Council that they have amended the entry in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to them to be of national importance, compiled and maintained by him under section 1 of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979, relating to the monuments situated in the Council's area and known as

North Calder, broch 600m W of Earney Hillock, chambered cairn 720m NE of Granton Mains, Bowermadden.

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Earney Hillock, chambered cairn 720m NE of Granton Mains, Bowermadden, comprises the grassed-over remains of a chambered long cairn of the Neolithic period, 5000 to 5500 years old, situated at 62m OD in cultivated land at the edge of an extensive boggy area. The area to be scheduled is irregular, measuring 55m NW-SE by 45m transversely. This area includes the features described above, as well as an area within which evidence for the construction and use of the site is likely to survive. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Bower and the County of Caithness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the subjects described in the Disposition by Trustee of James Christie Traill, in favour of John Keith dated 23 November 1922 and recorded in the Division of the General Register of Sasines for the County of Caithness on 20 December 1922 (the present owner whereof being James Plowman Sutherland, Granton Mains, Bower, Wick), is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.


