### THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979 ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as St Comgan's Chapel, tombstone, Glendale consists of a late medieval grave-slab situated within Kilchaon graveyard, Glasvin, Glendale, which remains in use. Kilchaon is the site of St Comgan's Chapel, but no trace of it now remains. However, foundations have been encountered when digging graves. The tombstone dates from the 15<sup>th</sup> century and is 1.5m long, 0.2m wide and c.6cm thick with one end (W) forming a broad point. The area to be scheduled measures about 3.5m by 2m, to include the grave slab and an area extending 1m around each side, apart from the S where scheduling extends to the boundary wall. The monument, which lies in the Parish of Duirinish and the County of Inverness as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the Property known as Burial Ground, Glendale (the present owner whereof being Highland Council, Skye and Lochalsh Area, Tigh na Sgire, Park Lane, Portree, Isle of Skye), is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.


