(NH 66632881) Grave Yard (Disused) (TI) Supposed site of Chapel (GT)

The site of a Roman Catholic Chapel situated in a small piece of uncultivated ground, now a disused burying ground. Nothing is known about it, and there is nothing to denote where it stood. All that can be seen are a few large round stones partly under ground marking the graves....."The site shewn..is the supposed site and is a small green mound".

"On the west side of a small hill called Tork (?Creagan an Tuirc), in the parish of Dunlichity, is Chapel Field, where, it is said, the parish church or chapel stood before it was transformed to Dunlichity". At this site (NH66642881) is a mound 59.0m east-west, 28.0m north-south, rising about 1.0m above the surrounding pasture land. The top of the mound is pitted with hollows of amorphous character, and no building outline can be discerned among them or at the position of the published siting symbol (NH66632881). No gravestones can now
