In the burying ground are the ruins of the church believed to be St.Ninian's, which fell in 1714. Killinianan or Nonakiln. In the churchyard was found part of a slab incised with what could be spectacle ornament. The slab has now disappeared, but there is a cast of it in Nat.Mus.Ants.Scot. which was presented by James Flaws, Castlehill, Wyre, through JM Corrie, F.S.A. Scot."(2)(3)(4)(5) "All that remains of this chapel is the W gable 8.2m long standing to roof height and containing a small rectangular door with a small arched window above. 


Fig. 1. Cast of a Sculptured Stone once in Nonikiln Kirkyard, Roskeen, Ross-shire. (5)
