A group of three buildings roughly aligned E/W tucked under a steep cliff, with a bank running along the front of them and the land falling away so they look south across marshland towards Sanna. It seems likely that these were a farmstead, perhaps consisting of house, byre and animal enclosure.  At least one roofed building is shown on the OS 1" 1856 First Series map 447700_a. All three buildings are shown on the 1872 OS 6" map 447700_b, with Structure 2 roofed. The western building, Structure 1, has disappeared by 1887 447700_c, and Strcuture 2 is still roofed.

447700.01 – 4477070055 – 8m x 5m, walls about 1m high, aligned 080deg. Door faces south, but lies at eastern end of the wall. The building is tucked close against the cliff along the north side. This building is shown as unroofed in the 1872 edition of the OS 6" map, but has disappeared from the 1897 6" map.

447700.02 – 4477970057 – 7m x 4.5m, walls better built than .01, standing to 1m high, aligned 080deg. Most of the south wall has collapsed. The building is further away from the cliff, and is the most covered with bracken, trees growing around it. The 19<sup>th</sup> century maps have this feature as roofed.

447700.03 – 4484670058 – 8m x 5.5m, aligned 100deg, only wall at west end still standing. Much of this structure is formed of large rocks which may already have been in place, suggesting it was always quite a crude structure. In all maps, this is shown as unroofed.

It is suggested that structure 2 is the house, 1 is the byre, and 3 is an animal enclosure.
