L-shaped walls against 45deg slope forming what is most likely to have been a temporary shelter in the hills to the west of Kilchoan rubbish tip. While most of the surrounding area is rough heather moorland, there are also irregular, bracken-covered fields suggesting the building may have been a shieling.
