There are a number of stone structures along the coastline to the south of Bourblaige, including what may be dwellings, an animal enclosure, stone walls, and fields with lazy beds and clearance cairns. It is assumed that these structures were part of the Bourblaige settlement. They could have been in permanent use, for example, as a fishermen's 'satellite' settlement, or they could have been used seasonally.
