The crofting township of Melvaig



Centred on NG 74261 86716

Melvaig is one of the Gairloch crofting townships created in 1845 by John Mackenzie, although early documents show that people lived here in 1660. The name Melvaig in Gaelic is 'Mealabhaig 'meaning 'bent grass bay ', and with aig associated with Viking vik it is possible that the area was settled before this. The Gairloch Estate maps show two main areas of settlement (see map) before the crofts were established and the older boundary head dyke can still be seen within the crofting township head dyke.



The township is situated on steeply sloping ground running from E to the shores of the Minch in the W. However the ground on the lower slopes is fairly fertile. Two corn drying kilns were found in the township, one beside the older boundary head dyke and a later one on croft 10 showing that crops have been grown and oral history confirms this.

A footbridge was built over the Melvaig river in 1895 and the road upgraded in 1954 at approximately the same time as the road continuing on to Ruadh Reidh lighthouse was begun

Access between the crofts was by 'pasaidh' and these can still be seen today.



There is a substantial slipway beside the river Melvaig in the neighbouring township of Aultgrishan, and below Melvaig the remains of two 'ports'. Fishing was once very important to supplement any agriculture.

The outline of the 'port' is just visible



Numerous walls and ruined buildings indicate that the river terraces by the Melvaig river were widely used




There were shops, butcher/abatoir, fish curer, schools, religious meeting houses, in Melvaig which have all closed. Today apart from some livestock there is no agriculture or fishing in the township.


