The Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979

Addition to the schedule of monuments

Historic Environment Scotland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979, hereby adds to the statutory schedule of monuments as set out below.

The monument known as **Creag Sron Chrubaidh**, **cairn 1km SSW of Inchnadamph Hotel** comprises the remains of a round cairn, dating to the Bronze Age (between around 2500BC and 800BC). It survives as a moss covered stony mound measuring around 9m in diameter and standing up to about 1m in height. Kerb stones survive around the eastern arc of the cairn. The monument is located at the foot of Creag Sron Chrubaidh cliffs, at around 90m above sea level.

The scheduled area is circular on plan with a diameter of 29m to include the remains described above and an area around them within which evidence relating to the monument's construction, use and abandonment is expected to survive.

The monument lies in the Parish of Assynt and the County of Sutherland, as shown in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.
