The stream called Sruthan Bhraigh nan Allt runs down the eastern side of the villages of Achosnich and Portuairk, and shows extensive evidence of use by man over the ages. Field walls, some substantial, rig and furrow workings, and stone structures are common, as well as evidence such as coppicing. The area is currently part of the common grazings of Portuairk and Achosnich townships.
