Canmore site 22131, Highland HER site MHG72, Historic Scotland scheduled monument no 6174 – the area includes the cairn and some land around it – see map on continuation sheet. It is referred to in these documents as 'Ben Hiant House'.

The cairn is made of beach stones. It has been pillaged from the top and from the NW side, where someone appears to have attempted to burrow into it. The area around it shows signs of some human activity, possibly an outer ring of stones.
